

INTERCULTURAL CRAFT: a bridge between knowings and cultures

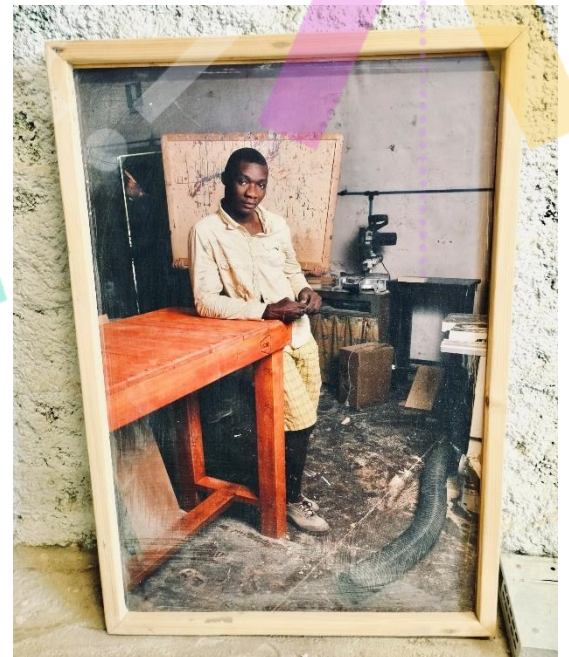


Our second phase of **INTERCRAFT** project aim to analyze the social enterprises located on the national territory of project partner countries. This analysis includes two types of activity: the desk analysis and the field analysis.

The **desk analysis** is led by [ODYSSEA](#) and it has the main purpose of researching, on national and European scale, the social enterprises in which migrants work and where they can practice form of intercultural craftsmanship.

After this first round of work, some of these social realities make their way to the **field analysis**, which gives the opportunity to immerse in the social fabric of the country partners involved by seeing first-hand what the social enterprises can offer. About 10/15 of them will be examined by collecting quantitative and qualitative data.

The field analysis will take place in 3 of the partners countries: in Italy conducted by the lead project partner [TERRA DI TUTTI](#), in Greece by [ODYSSEA](#), in Slovenia by [TERRA VERA](#), and one more on European level led by [UNIVERSITY OF FLORENCE](#).





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The field analysis which take place in Italy has already started, [TERRA DI TUTTI](#) will meet social enterprises all over Italy working in the fields of sustainable reuse, craftsmanship, immigration, solidarity economy, ethical fashion, social atelier, carpentry.

In Slovenia, instead, the field analysis is led by [TERRA VERA](#) who will visit social realities of the food sector, sustainable reuse and textile sector.

Last, but not least, the Greek field analysis guided by [ODYSSEA](#) will meet social enterprises related to sustainable agriculture and transportation solutions, craftsmanship and handcrafted jewelry.

The results of the previous activities will be the **INTERCRAFT ATLAS MAP** and the **INTERCRAFT JOINT CURRICULUM**. The first one consists of a general mapping of intercultural craft experiences, the second one is a definition of a methodological framework of the training path envisioned by all project partners.
